Information for next week

Non-uniform day

Children wearing costumes which are deemed to be too scary or inappropriate in any other way will be asked to change. We want all ages from Nursery upwards to enjoy this event.

Other information

Social Media use

We are dealing with lots of children who are struggling emotionally at the moment due to their use of social media and this ends up coming into school and causing issues within school also. Primary School aged children should not be using social media as the age for all platforms apart from WhatsApp is 13 and WhatsApp's age restriction is 16. If your child has downloaded these apps and set up an account, they will have had to put an older date of birth in which is not teaching them safe internet habits. The reason that they are restricted by age is that children need a certain level of maturity before they can communicate effectively on social media platforms. Children in school are also putting themselves at risk by posting videos and photos on different platforms without appropriate security or controls. Please ensure that all controls and security measures on children's devices are in place and that you check regularly to make sure that your child has not changed these.

Children are also explaining in school that they have watched content which is not appropriate for their age and is frightening them or causing them to lose sleep. Youtube is often the source of these videos but also streaming services that they have access to. Please monitor the programmes and videos that your child is accessing.

Finally, children are playing games which have an age restriction above their age. This is leading to children recreating some of these in their play which leads to inappropriate play. Please ensure that they are only able to access games within their age range.

Safety in the playground

Please can parents not allow children of any age to sit on the walls near the cloakroom doors of Finland, Netherlands, Italy, Spain and Denmark as it is one of our rules within the playground. Also, the trim trail is not to be used by children before and after school.

Gate and Registration in the morning

Registration happens at 8.40am each morning in the classrooms and therefore children should be in class by this time. The gate into the playground shuts at this time as the teachers and staff on doors need to be in the classrooms for the start of the day rather than in the cloakrooms or supervising the doors. Please do not be offended if you are asked to walk around to the main entrance, it just means that your child was not in class at 8.40am and therefore needs to be registered at the main entrance so that we know that they are in school. Parents who are still in the playground when the gates are shut will need to, from Monday, walk around the exterior of the building to get out through the car park gate.

OOSC entry in a morning

If your child is in OOSC in a morning, please ring the bell for OOSC so that a member of staff welcomes them at the door. They should not be allowed to enter with another adult as we have visitors and staff from Highbury in school and so every adult does not necessarily make sure that children from OOSC make it into the club.
