PINS Coffee morning

This is taking place on 28th November at the beginning of the school day in the hall. Any parents of pupils with SEND are welcome to attend the coffee morning as usual. There will also be people available to support with collating information from parents for the application of EHCPs.

Parking and traffic around the school

Recently, some of our school councillors worked with Katherine Jacobs from 'Living Streets' which is a company who want walking to school to be a choice we all make. They work with the local council to make our walks to school safer and more attractive.

We asked our families and the school staff to answer some questions to collect their views and ideas.

We looked at the main route to school for most families which is along Law Lane, from Cain Lane to Fairfax Avenue. We looked at the speed and flow of traffic and the size and quality of the pavements, curbs and crossings. We discussed how safe we felt crossing roads around our school and how other members of the community might feel walking around our school.

From the information we collected and from our ideas Katherine will make a plan and give it to the local council who will then decide on what improvements need to be made to the streets around our school.

In the meantime though, we ask that you do not park on pavements near to school as this makes it difficult for families with prams and buggies to get past on the pavements. It is also useful to know that you can park at Kitsons on Pinnar Lane as a safe place to park and stride to school.

Lunchboxes

Please can parents refrain from including chocolate and sweets in their child's lunchboxes. In Science and PRHE lessons, we encourage the children to eat healthily and it would support this learning if children's lunchboxes included a balanced, healthy variety of foods.

Improving Attendance information

As one of our school improvement priorities this year is to improve attendance, we have decided to add some information about attendance to each newsletter. Some schools have sent out long letters and leaflets with lots of information on but we feel that this is overwhelming in terms of how much information is included and this may lead to people not finding it useful. We have decided to try to provide the same information but over a number of bulletins. I hope that you find this helpful.

Does attendance affect my child's success at school?

Here's what the national data shows:

- Pupils with higher SATS results at KS2 had lower levels of absence over the key stage compared to those with lower SATS results.
- Pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths had an overall absence rate of 4.7% over the key stage, compared with 3.5% among pupils who achieved the expected standard and 2.7% among those who achieved the higher standard.
- Generally, the higher the percentage of sessions missed across the key stage at KS2, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.
- Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS2, 83.9% achieved the expected standard compared to 40.2% of pupils who were persistently absent.

Basically, children who attend school regularly achieve higher results and have more chance of reaching their full potential.

If you are struggling with getting your child into school, I have attached a document to this newsletter which offers support to parents through online sessions. If you book and take part in these, please let us know how useful they are so that we can advise other parents.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities information

Data from the PINS parent survey

The Senior Leaders met with Family Voice Calderdale this week who have analysed the results of the parent survey that took place at the end of the Summer term. We were delighted that they were able to report the following strengths as articulated by those parents that completed the survey:

•Exceptional Support for SEND Students: Parents greatly appreciate the dedication and care the school provides for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). They acknowledge staff efforts to go above and beyond, ensuring that students' unique needs are met with understanding and tailored support.

• Engaging School Environment: Many children express joy and enthusiasm about attending school, and parents note their satisfaction with the teachers and the overall school atmosphere.

• **Proactive SEND Leadership:** The SEND leader has been praised for quickly responding to concerns, initiating support and diagnosis processes effectively, and ensuring that measures are in place to assist students.

• Approachable and Receptive School Leadership: The head and deputy are recognized as being approachable and willing to engage with and listen to parents' concerns.

There were some aspects of our work that you suggested could be improved which we are working on as part of our involvement in the PINS project this year. We will report in our newsletter as we have plans for the improvement of these areas.
