# Improving Attendance information

As one of our school improvement priorities this year is to improve attendance, we have decided to add some information about attendance to each newsletter. Some schools have sent out long letters and leaflets with lots of information on but we feel that this is overwhelming in terms of how much information is included and this may lead to people not finding it useful. We have decided to try to provide the same information but over a number of bulletins. I hope that you find this helpful.

Why does it matter if my child is 5-10 minutes late?

As soon as children enter the classroom from 8.35am, they have important independent tasks to do or tasks with support from the additional adults in the classroom prior to them going to assembly.

For example,

- In Early Years, this is often the time when they are practising their name writing skills
- In other years, the children may be reflecting on their work from the day before, making corrections or completing additional challenges.
- Children who find spelling or reading challenging may be working on software to aid them with this.
- Children who find learning times tables difficult or need practice with calculations have time to practise with an adult or independently.

By missing 5 minutes of this time, each day, they miss out on 25 minutes a week or 16 hours a year. Arriving late also means that they don't get the settled, organised start to the day. We all know how it feels to arrive late to something important when everyone else is already settled. Children arriving late also may have to enter assembly when it's started.

It may seem like 'only a few minutes' but it makes such a difference to children's self-esteem, confidence and academic performance when they arrive on time.
