EYFS nativity tickets

Tickets for the EYFS nativity are available on School Gateway to purchase at £2 per ticket. The money raised goes into our enrichment fund which pays for all trips and workshops in school. We allocate 3 tickets per family, with a limit of 110 tickets being available for each performance. The tickets can be purchased for the same performance or for different e.g. you could have 3 tickets for the evening performance and no tickets for the morning performance or 2 tickets for one performance and 1 for the other. Please include a note of which performances you wish to be allocated tickets for in the payment request on School Gateway. Tickets will be allocated first come first served. There will not be any spare tickets available so please only pay a maximum of £6 for the tickets.

Improving Attendance Information

As one of our school improvement priorities this year is to improve attendance, we have decided to add some information about attendance to each newsletter. Some schools have sent out long letters and leaflets with lots of information on but we feel that this is overwhelming in terms of how much information is included and this may lead to people not finding it useful. We have decided to try to provide the same information but over a number of bulletins. I hope that you find this helpful.

What is a penalty notice?

If a child has 10 sessions (one day is classed as 2 sessions) of unauthorised absence within a 10 week period, this can be referred to the Educational Welfare Officer for a penalty notice to be issued. Penalty notices are a fine which are issued by the Educational Welfare Officers to parents. They can give each parent a fine of £80, rising to £160 if you do not pay within 21 days.

From this year, the statutory guidance has changed so that you can only get up to 2 fines for the same child in a 3-year period. If you get a second fine in 3 years it will be £160. If you do not pay the fine in 28 days you may be taken to court for keeping your child out of school. If your child is off school 3 or more times within the 3 years you will not be fined but may be taken to court.

Unauthorised absences include holiday absences, late arrival after 9am and absences where the reason is not considered a reasonable excuse for the child to be absent from school.

Obviously, at Withinfields, we want to support parents who find it difficult to maintain positive attendance for their children and Mrs Bayliss is trained to support families with this through the Early Help Pathway. If you feel that you need this support, please contact her through ClassDojo or through the office. She would be delighted to support you and your family with referrals to other avenues of support and with practical advice.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities information

Routines

I just wanted to reach out to all parents but particularly those parents of children with Special Educational Needs about the need to keep routines as normal as possible on this run up to Christmas. We often find that our children struggle in this next three weeks of term as Advent Calendars remind them that Christmas is getting closer and elves start making cheeky appearances! Although these are lovely things to do, they can interrupt normal morning routines which can lead to some children finding things a little overwhelming. If your child struggles with changes to their routines, please think about how best to incorporate festive activities, if you choose to do them, into their day without it leaving them unable to cope. For example, some elves may choose to be a little naughty during the school day so that the children see what they've been up to when they get home from school!

We try to keep all our activities as normal as possible until the very last week of term for this reason. If you are worried about how your child will cope with activities like the Christmas parties or the church service, please talk to your child's class teacher in the next few weeks so that we can make plans together to help them through this.
